 Judicial Summit on Mental Health had 2 tracks-Adult and Child and Adolescent. Sonia shared that there are opportunities to better share data across systems and that we were ahead of many communities because we already had worked through the SIM and have identified our priorities. Working on other jail diversion strategies as we continue to think through options for a CSU. Learned that there is an intercept -1: PUBLIC HEALTH, PREVENTION, EDUCATION!

MMHPI Engage and Excel conference takeaways—we are ahead of many communities with our collective impact initiative. Opportunities to improve response to MH crisis calls with the incorporation of MHMR, EMS, LE responding to calls. Able to share how we moved the VCN program from pilot to sustainability and the relationships needed to make that move successful.

Leah Jordan shared that she saw Denton County has an example for other counties in what we have been able to accomplish thus far. Captain Lee shared that the Judicial Summit wants results and is expecting to create movement within the Legislature to improve responses to justice involved individuals experiencing a mental health condition. Chris Martin reiterated that our group has breadth that other community coalitions do not. Gary Henderson reiterated that this group provides an advantage when we look for funding.

V. Year in Review
 S. Redwine
 Sonia reviews the priorities the leadership team identified in January. Top priorities include Jail Diversion, Case Management, Homelessness, Communication across the community, Funding for more programs, Need for grant writers, and Mental health with the homeless population.
 6 out of the 7 opportunities have been addressed. Using SIM to drive jail diversion. HB13 grant allowed us to increase case management positions with the Denton County Jail. DHLT and DCBHLT Veterans







workgroup working together to address Mayor's challenge to End Veteran Homelessness by 2020. Improved communication across sectors. HB13 funding jail diversion SIM intercepts 3-5. Conversations have begun with DHLT case conferencing team regarding SUD. Still working on getting a dedicated grant writer.

Mary Jones asked about homeless Veteran population numbers. Courtney Cross identified 48 households per HMIS.

Kathryn Stream asked about follow up regarding SIM. Sonia talked about reports for HB13. Captain Doug Lee mentioned Judge Ramsey is now a Denton County employee to help with diversion process.

Crisis Stabilization Unit is still a priority.

Terry Widmer acknowledges Col. Chris Martin and his Congressional Veteran Commendation for his work with the DCVC and the Veterans workgroup.

- a. Veterans-Chris Martin Homeless Veteran Stand Down with 29 Veterans. Veterans Workgroup will support funding opportunities for intensive case management for Veteran homelessness. Refining strategic plan. Meeting with VA officials about increasing MH services. Need space to house 3 MH providers, 120 sq ft per office, a group meeting space, and ADA compliant, and windows. VA townhalls
- b. Jail Diversion/MH Treatment Court-Captain Doug Lee/Tami Russell
 Transportation to and from MH facilities to court is a priority, incorporating the use of video conferencing. SOPs on how to make an involuntary commitment report/form for LE.
- c. Child and Family Systems-Dr. Lisa Elliott and Laura Prillwitz

 Twitter project forum delayed. Waiting to hear back from TTUHSC. Expand outreach to surrounding communities to provide education and resources.

Dr. Valenta mentioned the challenge of Saturday trainings and the length of MHFA training for teachers. He recognizes the need; 400 suicide outreaches a month in Denton ISD. Kathryn Stream suggested starting with school nurses. Dr. Valenta suggested exploring the idea of an exchange day in the summer. Mayhill open to funding MHFA.


