 Motion to accept UBH appointment, new CEO Awstin Gregg to DCBHLT. Chief Kerbow moved. Terry
 Widmer second. Motion approved by DCBHLT.

 Chief Kerbow moved to approve minutes. Second by TJ Gilmore. Motion approved by DCBHLT.
- III. Update from Brainstorming Activity S. Redwine 5 min.
 Sonia showed word cloud with an emphasis on diversion, case management.
 Top 7 opportunities from brainstorming activity include: Jail Diversion, Case Management,
 Homelessness, Communication across the community, funding for more programs, need for grant writers, Mental Health with the homeless population

Sonia will be sharing the top 7 with workgroups to see how this fits in with their current strategic goals.

In order to write grants and get more funding, we need a more complete picture of what the cost is associated with behavioral health in Denton County. Sonia will be reaching out to organizations to get a better picture of funding streams, expenses.

Communication across the community happens when we are talking about our work. We have some opportunities coming up, and I encourage you to consider those opportunities in addition to others. Additionally, we need to continue dialogue within the leadership team and our workgroups to gain progress.

IV. DCBHLT logo update G. Henderson 5 min.

V. Initiatives at Denton County Homelessness C. Cross 25 min.





Leadership Team

3 goals for the DCHLT of 1) Continuous Improvement of Homelessness Data Management in Denton County, 2) Increase Access to Housing, and 3) Support the Mission and Vision of DCHLT. Have focused on data collection through coordinated entry. Currently data is centered on literal homelessness.

Currently exploring a Housing Navigator position to negotiate leases to free up time for case managers at housing agencies. This role would also provide outreach and education to landlords.

Affordable housing needs in our community include 100-150 Permanent Supportive Housing, 300-350 Rapid Rehousing (3-6 months), 200 Diversion.

Case conferencing being used through data collected in coordinated entry to bring providers together to see which agency is working with a client, what services are being offered.

Tax incentives, public/private partnerships needed to bring in new housing options, especially for supportive and affordable housing.

Supportive Housing Pilot designed to first address Veterans, expanding to other persons experiencing homelessness. Case management is intensive and requires an increase in capacity to continue.

Mary Jones highlighted the Barriers Fund with Denton County Homeless Coalition to help pay day costs, client assistance to pay for things that don't have funding streams. Spring into Action donation match up to \$7500. Sonia will share information.

VI. HB13 Community Health Grant proposal S. Redwine 5 min.

Sonia will share the Denton County ACTS (Advocates for Comprehensive Treatment and Support) Logic model (See attached document). Addressed 5 different gaps identified in the Texas State Behavioral Health Strategic Plan in the proposal. Focused on 3 vulnerable populations: justice-involved, Veterans, persons experiencing homelessness. The grant asked for \$750,000, half from the state, half in-kind. Proposal asked for increased staffing capacity; 4 QMHP in the jail, case manager dedicated to individuals exiting jail, sustain 2 VCN positions and an outreach coordinator for Veterans, 1 case manager for housing.



Denton County ACTS Logic Model

Goal: Timely access to mental health services and continuity of care across agencies

Inputs

- DCBHLT provides direction for workgroups

- MHMR provides training
- Case Manager for housing navigator
- VCN staff for shortterm case management
- Veteran Outreach Coordinator to identify resources and develop partnership

Activities

- DCBHLT offers volunteer time for workgroup
- UWDC staff offers oversight
- County Jail staff will conduct MH Assessment, ANSA, coordinate treatment plan, & assist with discharge planning
- MHMR staff offers training for Jail staff
- MHMR Jail CM will connect with jail staff for discharge planning and transitional support
- Housing CM will provide navigation to clients with MI
- VCN will offer referrals and support for Veterans & families

Outputs

Short Term Outcomes

- Improved early identification at jail booking for mental health needs
- Enhanced communication upon exit from jail measure by conversations recorded between MHMR and Jail
- Appropriate referrals made to MH services

- Improved ANSA scores in behavioral health domain with continuity of care
- Decrease wait time for inmate-patients to be seen upon exit from jail

Long Term Outcomes

- Jail Diversion with reduced recidivism
- Increase in housing capacity
