I. Welcome T. Widmer 5 min.

Terry Widmer called the meeting to order at 8:06 a.m.

II. Consideration of Minutes from T. Widmer 2 min.

 Terry Widmer called for a motion to approve the July minutes. The Honorable Bobbie Mitchell moved to approve the minutes. Dr. Roxanne Del-Rio seconded. July minutes approved.

III. Presentation: Office of the Governor's Child

Sex Trafficking Team – Denton County

Dr. T. Grover/M. Boren

Dr. Tomi Grover with the Office of the Governor's Child Sex Trafficking Team – Denton County, and Meredith Boren with the Childrens Adovacy Center for Denton County provided a presentation on current data, needs and solutions surrounding child commercial sexual trafficking (CST) in Denton County.

Dr. Grover stated that child sex trafficking occurs when a person knowingly traffics a child under the age of 18 and causes, by any means, the child to engage in or become the victim of commercial sex acts or child sex abuse; receives benefit from participating in a venture that involves commercial sex acts or sex abuse; or engages in sexual conduct with a trafficked child. Texas ranks second in the country for the most human trafficking, and the National Trafficking Hotline receives the second largest number of calls from Texas with 79,000 youth CST victims in Texas at any given time.

The Office of the Governor utilizes a five-fold strategy to address trafficking as follows: protect, recognize, recover, restore, and bring justice. Next steps in addressing trafficking in Denton County include identifying plans that support options for youth in recovery from trafficking, the extent of care coordination and filling in gaps to build a continuum of care for youth under 24 years old.

The Office of the Governor's Child Sex Trafficking Team in Denton County utilizes a collaborative approach to address this public health issue and is engaged with stakeholders across sectors including nonprofits, law enforcement, and DFPS. The CACDC is an essential component through their work in formulating a multidisciplinary team response. The CACDC provides advocates on scene, forensic interviews, therapy, shelter, food, and other supportive services that foster stability. Additionally, the Governor's Team is working with Kyle's Place as potential location for a drop-in center for victims of trafficking.

IV. Homelessness Leadership Team Update C. Cross 15 min. Courtney Cross provided an update on the Denton County Homelessness Leadership Team. The City of Denton approved its budget to support the expansion of the Monsignor King Outreach Center (MKOC). This expansion includes transitioning to being open 7 nights a week rather than 3, as well as transitioning away from being entirely operated by volunteers, to hiring an executive director, assistant director, and a housing-focused case manager. MKOC will operate an Enhanced Shelter Model, which will provide designated beds for 90-120 days with right of return for individuals enrolled in case management and working towards a housing plan. UWDC is providing technical support to MKOC as it expands.

The lack of a day shelter for people experiencing literal homelessness is still a gap in Denton County, though agencies are communicating potential solutions to address this and have support from the City of Denton. Denton County may see agencies begin to co-locate in the coming years to fill this gap. A key to this approach is funding for permanent housing solutions.

Denton County's Housing Crisis Response System is preparing for a change in funding for homelessness prevention and intervention. Denton County has historically relied on the HHSC's Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) for Homeless Prevention (HP), Emergency Shelter (ES), and Rapid Rehousing (RRH) funding, however, no Denton County agencies will be receiving HHSC ESG funding this year for RRH. The City of Denton has allocated \$100,000 in stop-gap funding and will be releasing an RFP for emergency shelters. Agencies that applied for HUD Continuum of Care funding for HP, ES, and RRH will be awarded in April 2020, if approved. Additionally, the City of Denton has allocated a \$40,000 match to the Barriers Fund and will match donations made dollar-for-dollar up to \$40,000 through 2020.

The DCHLT is working towards its goal of Ending Veteran Homelessness by 2020 and has engaged local partners in utilizing a HUD benchmark tool to track outcomes, progress, and barriers.

V. Workgroup Updates

a. Veterans-Chris Martin

Chris Martin provided on update on the Veterans workgroup. The workgroup continues to identify strategic goals and opportunities, including increasing availability and accessibility of resources for aging and/or isolated Veterans, and military cultural competency training for service providers. Peer to Peer engagement opportunities for Veterans has not successful historically, but this workgroup may focus specifically on peer to peer opportunities for substance use. Veterans workgroup members have been participating in planning the 5th Annual Homeless Veteran Standdown, which will take place October 24, 2019 at the Denton Civic Center. Veterans experiencing literal homelessness will be paired with a community volunteer to help get connected to local resources, as well as participate in free haircuts and food.



- b. Jail Diversion/MH Treatment Court-Captain Doug Lee/Tami Russell Captain Doug Lee provided an update on the Jail Diversion/MH Treatment Court workgroup. The workgroup has made progress in a broad range of areas but needs to refine its goals to maximize time and resources spent and is working towards engaging more diverse members to allow for greater success. The workgroup has begun identifying strategic goals and will continue strategic planning discussions in the upcoming meetings.
- c. Child and Family Systems-Dr. Lisa Elliott and Laura Prillwitz Laura Prillwitz provided an update the Child and Family Systems workgroup. The workgroup has signed a partnership agreement with Okay to Say, a campaign intended to reduce stigma surrounding mental health. Additionally, workgroup members have begun identifying strategic goals and will be finalizing strategic plans in the upcoming months. The workgroup will be bringing a new focus on child commercial sexual exploitation, specifically community education and prevention. Two free trainings will be offered on use of the Commercial Sex Exploration-Identification Tool (CSE-IT) on October 11, 2019 at Serve Denton and October 29th at the Carrollton Police Department.

Dr. Tomi Grover offered assistance connecting with stakeholders across the state, such as Traffick911 and City Square in Dallas, which operates a drop-in center for victims in partnership with After 8 to Educate.

d. HB-13 Update

Leah Jordan provided an update on the HB-13 grant. The purpose of the grant is to increase access to mental health services for Veterans and Veteran dependents, those with housing needs, and justice-involved individuals, which is the largest component. HHSC approved the requested amendments to the grant, including two additional QMHPs at DCMHMR and using funds differently within the grant. DCMHMR and the Veteran Community Navigators have been strong partners in this process.

e. Strategic Planning Update

Hope Rodgers provided an update on DCBHLT strategic planning logistics. Hope will be communicating with the Strategic Planning Committee to coordinate a meeting in the coming weeks to begin reviewing first drafts of DCBHLT workgroup proposed strategic plans. A common barrier amongst the three workgroups thus far is a lack of treatment options in Denton County for substance use disorders.

- UWDC has secured a local VA staff person to represent the VA at Veteran workgroup meetings.
- The Workgroup has completed a first draft of its new strategic plan. Members will finalize goals and collaborative partners in the December meeting, and will prioritize discussion surrounding establishing holistic programs to increase well-being for Veterans and their families in Denton County. Primary areas of interest include resources for aging and/or isolated Veterans, military cultural competency training for service providers, supporting ongoing needs of Veterans experiencing homelessness, and resources to increase financial literacy and well-being for Veterans and their families.
