### **Advance Together Update**

- Implementation design funding of up to \$300,000 over 3 years
- Timeline:
  - Implementation Grant released September 1<sup>st</sup>
  - Grant due October 7<sup>th</sup>
  - Short video interview mid-November
  - Implementation phase kick-off January 2021
- 7 Focus Groups Completed
- Focus groups on short break until June 30<sup>th</sup>
- Community engagement consultation with Bill Traynor on June 30th


- Expansion of NCTC Services

# **Cumberland Presbyterian Children's Home Family Residential Program**


- Currently serving 8 families
- Financial coaching started back June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2020
  - COVID-19 Survey
- Volunteer financial coaches scheduled to return (virtual or social distancing) in July 2020
- Program extension available for families due to COVID-19





# **Pathways to Success Program**


- Program transferred in November 2019
- 5 clients successfully graduated
   December 2019
- 14 clients currently being served
  - 6 clients on progress to graduate in August 2020
  - 1 client relocating
- Anticipated program completion
   Summer 2022



#### Discussion: Focus Group Discussion Following WSLT Meeting

- Understanding of Root Cause for Core Problem
  - o Individualized barriers Racial inequalities/inequities, Educational barriers, Financial barriers Systemic barriers lack of resources.
  - o There are also generational barriers
- Strategies for Addressing Root Cause
  - o Increase exposure to opportunity and implement better tracking of outcomes
  - o Incorporate a 2-generation approach when working with individuals, work with the children too. This can be bi-directional. When working with children, we can incorporate the parents.
  - Program at NCTC incorporates informational sessions for parents and includes ways they can further their education.
- Defining Success
  - o Improved education, financial security, childcare, a larger pool of employable people.
  - o These benchmarks need to be further defined with measures applied.
  - o Effectiveness of integrated services is variable and dependent on access and starting point.
  - o Progress looks different for everyone.
  - o Include access to mental healthcare in our integrated service model.
- Seeding Conversations with the Community
  - o The Equity council should have autonomy to facilitate conversations and create measures for progress
